1. CALL TO ORDER & NOTICE OF MEETING

The Special Meeting of the Village of Taos Ski Valley Council was called to order by Mayor Brownell at 2:00 p.m. The notice of the Special Meeting was properly posted.

3. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

4. REGIONAL REPORTS

TSVI CEO David Norden made a presentation on a public private partnership proposal for a Clean Energy Transportation and Recreation Corridor. The four components of this initiative would be focusing on Clean Energy Transportation, Outdoor Equity on trails, campgrounds, and bike paths, Watershed Management and Land Stewardship, and on Roadways. The transportation element would focus on an electric vehicle public bus system, and electric gondola within the Village, electric charging and super charging stations, and on a new scenic Village arrival and public transit drop-off. The outdoor equity element would involve new bike paths and bike lanes connecting towns to and from outdoor recreation, new USFS trail upgrades, new bus shelters to provide access to all, and a new pedestrian trail network. The watershed management and land stewardship element would involve protection of the Rio Hondo, infrastructure improvements to enhance water quality as well as forest health and sustainability. For roadway improvements the focus would be to upgrade Route 64 from town to the OBL, to upgrade Route 150 from OBL to Arroyo Seco, and to create a "Scenic Byway" along Route 150. Partners involved in the initiative would be Kit Carson Electric, NCRTD, NMDOT, the NM Outdoor Recreation Division, the State

of New Mexico, Local entities such as Taos County, Town of Taos, and Village of Taos Ski Valley, the Rocky Mountain Youth Corps, TSVI, the Nature Conservancy, Trout Unlimited, and the USFS. Mr. Norden explained that the benefits include clean water and air for all, outdoor access for all, to be a prototype project for regional expansion, to obtain private investment along with public funding, and to be an economic driver for rural norther New Mexico. In addition, such a project would align with the federal infrastructure bill and with State initiatives. He said that the total costs of this project would total \$150 million, with the State to put in one half of the funds. It will be important to move quickly to accomplish such an initiative.

5. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. PUBLIC HEARING: Consideration to Approve Application No. 1208909 for a Restaurant B Liquor License by Taos Brewing Company, LLC dba Door 38 Pizza @ Taos Ski Valley

The Village received notification on October 26, 2021 from the NM Regulation and Licensing Department that Taos Brewing Company applied for a Restaurant B Liquor License. The application has preliminary approval from the Director of the NM Regulation and Licensing Department. The Governing Body shall hold a Public Hearing in the question of whether the NM Regulation and Licensing Department should approve the proposed issuance. All posting and publishing requirements had been met. The applicant's address will be 105 Sutton Place, the location of the former Stray Dog Cantina.

PUBLIC HEARING: Applicants Justin Lea and Rick Martin both spoke in favor, as well as TSVI CEO David Norden. No one spoke against. The Public Hearing was closed.

Notice of the Public Hearing was published for thirty days, on October 28, 2021, and subsequently on November 4, 2021, as required. The applicant's address will be 105 Sutton Place, the location of the former Stray Dog Cantina.

RECOMMENDATION: Council should hold a Public Hearing on this application and take a vote on Application No. 1208909 for a Restaurant B Liquor License by Taos Brewing Company, LLC dba Door 38 Pizza @ Taos Ski Valley.

The Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division (ABC) has reviewed the referenced Application and granted **Preliminary Approval**. It is being forwarded to you for Local Option District approval or disapproval of the Liquor License Application.

Notice of the Public Hearing required by the Liquor Control Act **shall be given by the governing body by publishing a notice** of the date, time, and place of the hearing **twice during the 30 days prior to the hearing** in a newspaper of general circulation within the territorial limits of the governing body. **The first notice must be published at least thirty (30) days before the hearing. Both publications must occur before a hearing can be conducted.** The notice shall include:

- (A) Name and address of the Applicant/Licensee;
- (B) The action proposed to be taken;
- (C) The location of the licensed premises.

In addition, if the Local Option District has a website, **the Notice shall also be published on the website.**

While the law states that "within forty-five (45) days after receipt of a Notice from the Alcoholic Beverage Control, the governing body shall hold a Public Hearing in the question of whether the department should approve the proposed issuance or transfer", we recognize the potential for conflict between the requirement for publication of 30 day notice and the 45 day hearing requirement.

With that in mind, when a local governing body receives a liquor license application from ABC, that governing body has a couple of options:

- 1) Hold a hearing on the license application within the statutory time frame of forty-five (45) days, as required by the Liquor Control Act, and comply with all other statutory and regulatory procedures and notify ABC of your decision within thirty (30) days of the hearing;
- 2) Request from ABC an extension of time, past the forty-five (45) days, designating how much additional time will be needed to conduct the hearing in compliance with all statutory and



regulatory procedures. After the extension is granted and the hearing is held, notify ABC of your decision within thirty (30) days of the hearing;

ABC has no preference in the option you choose.

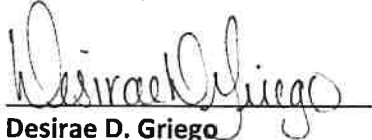
The governing body is required to send notice by certified mail to the Applicant of the date, time, and place of the Public Hearing. The governing body may designate a Hearing Officer to conduct the hearing. **A record shall be made** of the hearing.

The Applicant is seeking a Restaurant B Liquor License.

Within thirty (30) days after the Public Hearing, the governing body shall notify ABC of their decision to approve or disapprove the issuance or transfer of the license by signing the enclosed original Page 1 of the Application. The original Page 1 of the Application must be returned together with the notices of publication. **If the Governing Body fails to either approve or disapprove the issuance or transfer of the license within thirty days after the Public Hearing, the Director may issue the license.**

If the Governing Body disapproves the issuance or transfer of the license, it shall notify ABC within thirty (30) days setting forth the reasons for the disapproval. A copy of the Minutes of the Public Hearing shall be submitted to ABC with the Notice of Disapproval (*Page 1 of the Application, noting disapproval*).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The new Core Arrival Road, "Bison Road", connecting State Road 150 with Twining, Sutton and Thunderbird Roads and an adjacent public bus/shuttle drop-off area is a Tax Increment Development District (TIDD) eligible project to be designed and built by TSVI. Once completed, it is contemplated that the project would be accepted by the Village and dedicated as a public right-of-way. According to the TIDD Master Development Agreement (MDA), Section 4(A), the Village has the right to formally approve construction documents for any component of eligible infrastructure such as the arrival road.

The MDA contemplates that any TIDD project will be formally approved by the Village Council (or officers/departments, authorized by direction of the Village Council) before being accepted as public infrastructure. Continuous examination and formal review are necessary as the project progresses because the Village may be assuming some risk and cost, at taxpayer expense, of maintaining this public infrastructure over time.

TSVI's plans have continued license approval with the USFS for the construction of improved parking and roadway over the USFS property, (located within the boundary of TSVI's US Forest Service special use permit (SUP)), that has been continually used as a right-of-way by residents, visitors, and workers since well before Village incorporation in July 1996. An easement is anticipated for dedication to the Village for public access to the Entry Road and an adjacent public drop off area. The roadway improvements include a historic cultural entryway atmosphere/landscaping, increased roadside snow storage capacity, better drainage with more unpaved surface, paved walkways, underground electric installation, improved (lower) net slope to the roadway, lighting, and will continue under management by TSVI.

Village Staff reviewed the 90% Entry Road plan and design and found that the drawings should be recommended to the Village Council for consideration and approval as a planned TIDD-eligible project, with the condition that the Village and the Developer work toward an MOU that does not increase Village costs, and the condition that the TSVI engineer communicate with a Village engineer for a matching transition to the Village plan for Twining Road.

RECOMMENDATION: Move to accept the review and recommendation of the Village Staff for the plan and 90% design for improvements to the new Core Arrival Road right of way and adjacent public bus/shuttle drop off area.

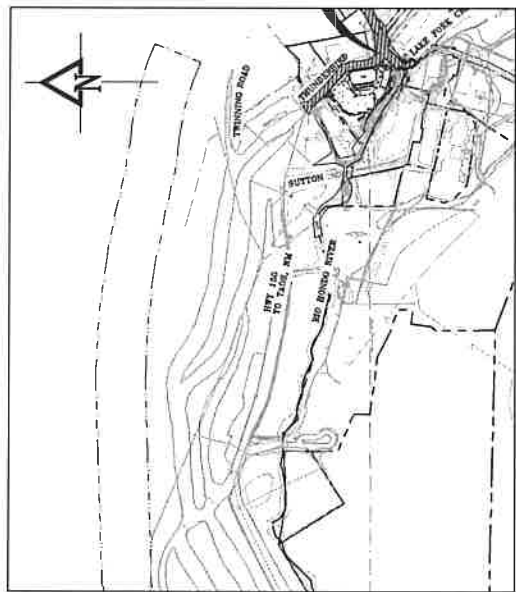

The contractor shall be responsible for the costs of any testing required as a result of failed test results. Testing shall be performed by the original geotech firm.
- 10) Where construction occurs in or across asphalt or concrete pavement, saw cut the pavement for a clean straight edge 6" outside the trench limits to allow clean removal and a good surface for proper patching.
- 11) All pavement saw cuts shall be 90° to one another.
- 12) The contractor shall replace or replace any public or private improvements in kind including but not limited to: sidewalks, curbs, drainage, etc., that were removed or damaged during construction.
- 13) The contractor shall relocate street signs temporarily during construction, then replace as required, including 1-foot them, initial post, mounting hardware, etc.
- 14) The contractor shall be responsible for protection of all existing asphalt from construction equipment. Damaged asphalt shall be replaced by the contractor at his expense.
- 15) Contractor shall provide all utility crossing and tie in points prior to construction to verify position and depth in order to avoid for interference with proposed lines. Conflicts shall be addressed before pipe installation.
- 16) All storm sewer pipe shall be 150 smooth lined corrugated plastic pipe (SLCPP) or engineer-approved equivalent. All pipe joints shall be integral bell with a water-tight gasket.
- 17) All manholes shall have a minimum 20-day strength of 4000 PSI. Where pipe-locations conflict use the more stringent rating.
- 18) Culvert inlet screens shall be Hecla Industries OS Series or engineer approved equal.

Grading and Drainage Notes:

- 1) It is the Special Use Permit (SUP) holder's and their Contractor's responsibility to provide all needed equipment and other means of dust abatement and control to avoid wind erosion of excavated material and local nuisances due to neighboring businesses and residences in the Village and forest visitors accessing local recreation destinations.
- 2) Any settlement or soil accumulations beyond the limits of construction due to grading or erosion shall be repaired immediately by the contractor.
- 3) Any construction debris or mud tracking on adjacent streets, or any other private or public drive shall be removed immediately by the contractor in accordance with the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). The contractor shall immediately fix any damage to existing pavement caused by construction equipment. The contractor shall properly barricade the site until construction is completed. Pursuant to the contractor to correct any of the above within 48 hours of written notice by TSV or TSVY shall result in a stop work order and/or do the work and make a claim against the letter of credit for any cost incurred by the agency.
- 4) Areas being disturbed by the grading shall be revegetated with native vegetation or as approved on the development plan or SWPPP.
- 5) A Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) shall be included as part of construction.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Village Clerk submitted the Election Resolution approved by Council at its October regular meeting to the NM Office of the Secretary of State. The next steps are for the Secretary of State to issue its election proclamation on December 1, 2021, and for the Village Clerk to post the location of early voting, which will be the Village Office. The Secretary of State's proclamation must be published in the newspaper by the Village and must be posted to the Village web site, by December 16, 2021. Other deadlines follow, as outlined in the Election Calendar attached.

Candidate declaration day is January 4, 2022, between 9 and 5 at the Village of Taos Ski Valley office of the Clerk. There are three positions up for election due to the four-year term having passed, and these are for Mayor Christof Brownell, Councilor Jeff Kern, and Councilor Chris Stagg.

Absentee ballots must be requested of the Village Clerk, and early voting will commence on February 1, 2022 between 9 and 4 at the Village Office, 7 Firehouse Road, Taos Ski Valley, NM 87525, Monday to Friday. The last day for early voting will be Saturday February 26, 2022 between 10 and 6 at the Village Office.

Voting on Election Day March 1, 2022 will take place from 7 to 7 at the Inn at Taos Valley, 1314A, State Road 150, Taos Ski Valley, NM 87525.
